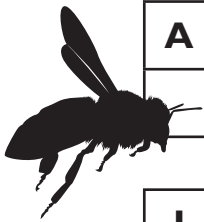

2. Take turns guessing the location of your opponent's flowers by calling out the number and letter of a square.
3. Mark any "hits" or "misses" in your opponent's garden using the lower garden grid.
4. Find all their flowers first and you become the pollinator queen (or king) bee!

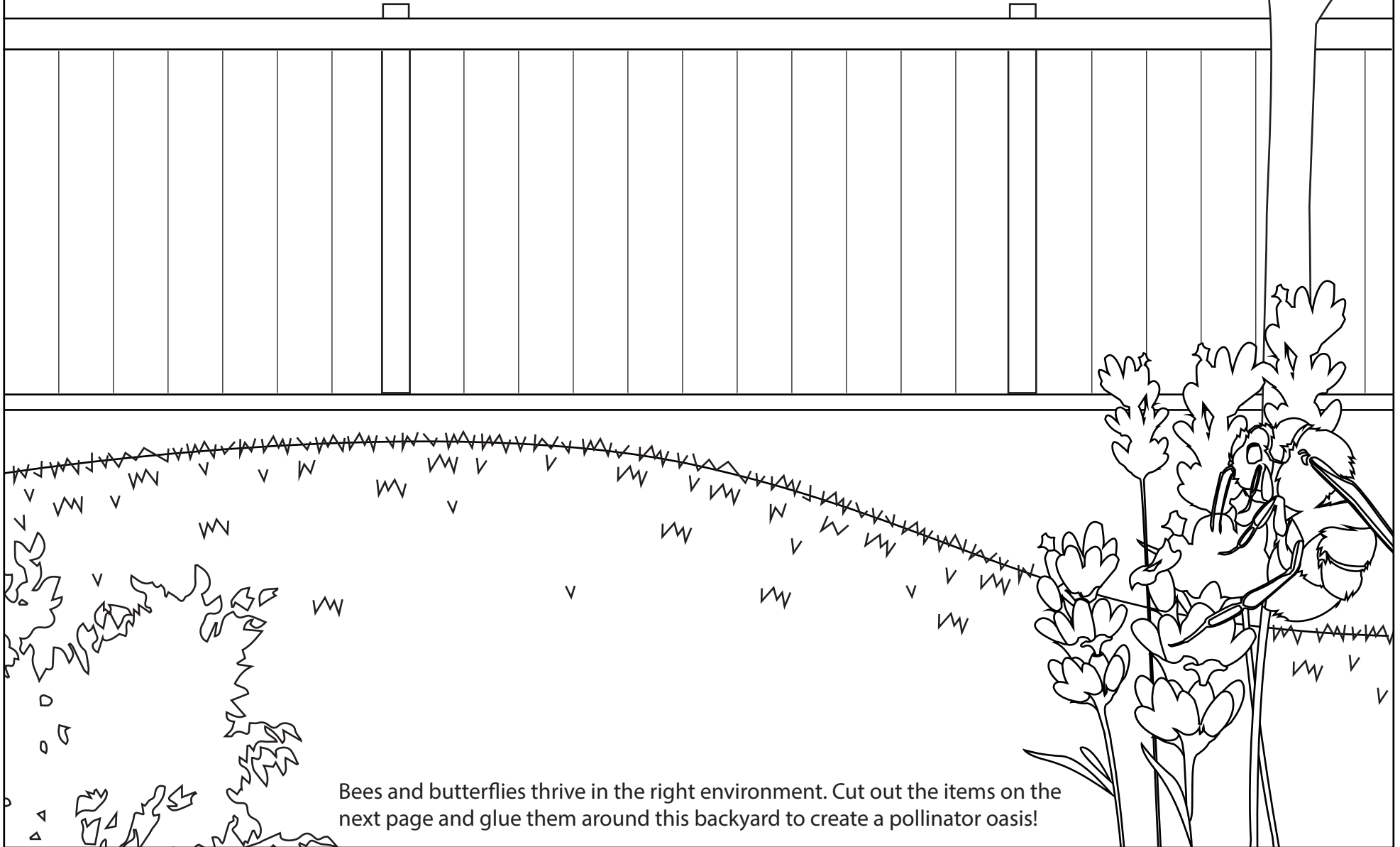

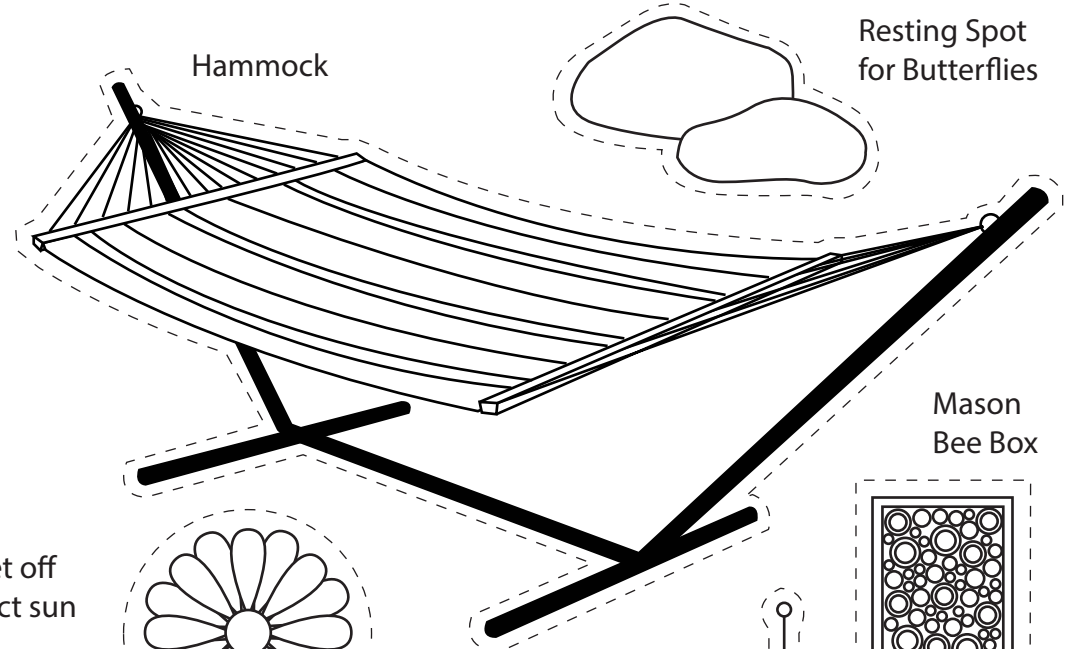


Bees and butterflies thrive in the right environment. Cut out the items on the next page and glue them around this backyard to create a pollinator oasis!



Use these items to get started,
then add your own ideas!

- Hummingbirds like to sip nectar from gooseberry bushes.
- Honey bees enjoy iris flowers
- Mason bees love a protected tunnel shaped nest
- Carpenter bees like to nest in cottonwood or willow tree logs, leave some on the ground
- Butterflies would love a Pacific dogwood tree (water well!)
- Bats need a bat box at least 12 feet off the ground with 6-8 hours of direct sun



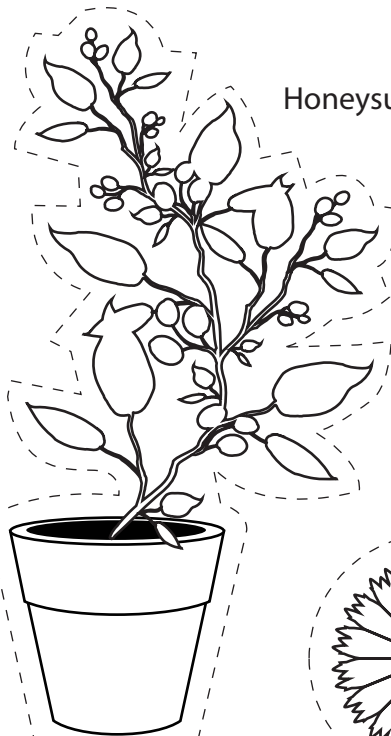

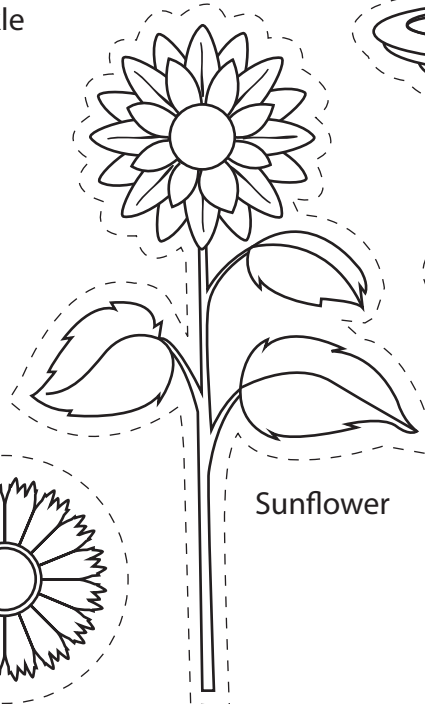
